4. MATTERS ARISING:

Cambridge Golf Club delegate stated that affiliation fees had now been paid.

5. REPORTS FROM THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:

PRESIDENT:

Mrs Farrow reported:

The Captains' Meeting in January held at St Neots was the perfect start to the season. This informal meeting was a wonderful chance to meet all the 23 new Captains or their deputies and to hear their views and expectations.

The County Competitions were once again very efficiently run and well supported and full reports will follow from the Officials responsible. However, I would like to comment on a few which I either attended in my official capacity, or as a competitor.

The total enthusiasm and wonderful talent witnessed at the Junior Meetings makes these events quite special and thanks must go to Marcella Tuttle, CJO and her Committee for their dedication to the young golfers in our county.

Almost gale force winds affected Division 1 Meeting at Royston and the Mary Cole at Ely but that did not deter the players and the intense but friendly inter-club rivalry at the Mary Cole is just what we expect here in Cambs & Hunts and the Autumn Foursomes at St Neots seemed to round off the season perfectly with a similar friendly "end of term" atmosphere.

Congratulations to Julie Walter (St Ives) who won the County Championship at Cambridge Meridian. Julie has retired from County 1st Team Golf and so was not part of the team which represented Cambs. & Hunts at County Match Week at Stockbrook Manor. Essex, in June. Every player was a credit to themselves and were excellent ambassadors for the County in senior and junior events.

Congratulations to the winners of the 3 Inter Club Finals. Abbotsley successfully defended the Mary Cole at Ely, Girton won the Grace Norman at Lakeside Lodge and Bourn won the Jean Wilkinson at Royston.

Several ladies were successful in National events. Congratulations to: Paula Parker (Abbotsley) who was selected to play for England in International Seniors matches; to Julia Gray and Lindy Clemmow (Bourn) who won through to the Final of the Australian Spoons which took place during County Finals week at Pleasington Golf Club; to Liliias Adamson and Sue Pearson (Ely City), who won the 4 Ball Ping Plate Final at Gainsborough and went on to a Grand final at Kingsbarns, Scotland, and Kim Morley (Bourn) who won the Midlands Silver Medal Final at Kettering. Our very successful juniors will be reported on later.

Presidents Day at St Neots in August was once again a great success raising £1823 for County funds. For this I am indebted to the generous support of all county members and Clubs for their participation and donations.

Greta Barclay and Elaine Bright of Ely attended all the County Meetings and compiled detailed reports with photographs for the local press or our web-site. Their work is vital and very much appreciated and on your behalf I thank them for this commitment and for giving us so much of their time. Finally, to all the Officials of the Executive Committee; my thanks for without their dedication and expertise we would not be able to function and you the members would not be able to enjoy competitive County competitions. Without these dedicated officials, my year would not have so easy. I am lucky to be part of this great team.

CAMBRIDGE DEVELOPMENT OFFICER:

MR JOHN HARVEY GAVE A PRESENTATION FROM THE CGP

Sport England was started in 2004 with National Lottery and Exchequer Money to distribute funds to National Bodies in sport.

Golf did not have one national body, so had to get together to form a single partnership (English Golf Partnership) comprising Women, Men and Professionals. Golf Foundation are part of this although they cannot vote, being a charitable organisation.

In 2005 9 million was received to grow, sustain and excel in the game.

In 2007/8 Cambridgeshire formed their Golf Partnership to access funds from the English Golf Partnership and appointed me as their Development Officer.

The partnership received £12,000 as a set fund with grants of £8,500, £5,000 from Living Sport (to get families playing) £3,000 from Cambridge Community Foundation (to purchase equipment which includes an inflatable net and trigolf). Several clubs have held Family Introduction Days with over 200 people attending.

The net has been taken to Parkers Piece for the Children's Festival, Impington School and Abbotsley Fete.

We are encouraging best practice within clubs by helping them attain the Golfmark (national accreditation). So far 16 clubs have registered, 2 awarded (Saffron Walden & Links) and 3 clubs close to achieving Golf Mark (Girton, Gog Magog and St Neots).

The next 4 year rolling funding to England Golf until 2013 is £13 ½ million.

We will receive £81,000 of this in 6 monthly tranches. £11,500 for core activity, County Academy Programme and to coach talented youngsters below county level.

Money will be used to train coaches and interviews will be held shortly for these posts. This will include recruitment of children through schools and venues who have attained Golfmark or who are actively working towards it.

The inflated net will be at the Grafton Centre and Huntingdon in the near future. It is available to all clubs to promote the game e.g. taster days, best practice, attraction to population in general. Jan Stockham has done wonderfully well but more volunteers are needed to develop the game ideas to increase funding.

Website has been commissioned; funding which should have been received last April will come through in the next few weeks to enable us to do this.

SECRETARY:

Mrs Ratcliffe reported:

There have been 5 committee, a competition and finance meeting and a Captain's meeting held during the year.

Thanks to Girton and Gog Magog golf clubs for the use of their dining rooms for the meetings and AGM.

I hope you have all looked at the new website. Since October there have been 1,000 visitors, 26 ladies have signed up as members to view the private pages and 7 to receive news. But the site should really start to work next year when all the events start. I urge to have a look if you have not already done so. I am sure you will agree that our web designer Cecilia Holden has done an excellent job.

Longstanton Golf Club has re-affiliated to the County, taking the total of clubs to 26 for 2009

In 2010 the affiliation fees will be collected by the EWGA.

County Golf Partnership: A ladies representative is still required on this committee; anyone interested contact Jan Stockham.

Dates for the next year's committee meetings are 15th Mar, 24th May, 5th July, 6th Sept, and 18th Oct with the AGM on the 25th Nov.

There will be an extra meeting this year on 30th Nov (all Delegates have been notified) to discuss the Resolutions put forward by the EWGA concerning the Amendments to the Rules of the Association. These resolutions should have been discussed in your Ladies committees. We have also received notification that LGU rules are changing. Main point, it is proposed that it becomes a company limited by shares and changes from LGU to LGU Championships Ltd (LGUCL). All details on www.lgu.org and www.englishwomensgolf.org

I attended the EWGA last January although I was unable to attend the LGU AGM (it was held in Belfast).

I am retiring as Secretary after 4 years; I have enjoyed it immensely, working with Rosemary and before that Jan Stockham who have always been supportive along with everyone on the Executive Committee. I look forward to spending more time with my Grandchildren and Husband. I have seen many changes during my term of office, including the modernisation of the EWGA from the ELGA. I am sure you are all aware talks have been resumed with the EGU to discuss amalgamation, who knows where this will lead?

I wish every success to my successor Mrs Jacquie Richardson.

Good Luck to the County Team next year, I will be there supporting Fiona and her team. And a big thank you as Delegates, keeping you clubs informed of all that is going on in the County.

I hope you all have a good golfing year in 2010.

CAPTAIN:

Miss McGlashan reported:

My first season as County Captain has been one of mixed fortunes. We started the season with a Training for Performance Seminar encouraging both 1st and 2nd team squad players to monitor their performance using training diaries and stats analysis. Practice sessions throughout the winter were focused on honing long and short game skills, each player attaining and trying to improve their long and short game handicaps.

Practice matches against the Thetford Myhill Men's Scratch team, Northants Ladies, the County Men, the County Senior Men and the Gogs Men's Scratch Team resulted in 2 wins and 3 losses but enabled me to try out new foursomes pairings and view players' attitudes in singles matches.

After the County Championships, the County team selected was – Caroline Agnew, Jackie Gregg and Hermione Fitzgerald (Link), Janet Phipps, Miranda Brain and Chelsey Herbert (Gog Magog), Jenny McGuigan (Royston) and Amy Rae (Lakeside Lodge). Team reserves were Sarah Smith (Links), Jane McGuffog (Gog Magog) and Bethany Peckham (Menzies). The Squad met at the beginning of June for a practice weekend at Stock Brook Manor in Essex and then we went straight into County Match Week.

Results Mon 5-4 loss against Norfolk, Tues halved with Suffolk, Wed won 6 ½ – 2 ½ against Bedfordshire, Thurs loss 6 ½ – 2 ½ against Essex and Fri loss to Hertfordshire 6-3

We Finished overall 4th place, tied with Suffolk. Hertfordshire retained the East Region title and went on to runner-up place in the County Finals finishing 1.5 pts behind Lancashire. Miranda Brain was awarded her county colours.

As I said, mixed fortunes for the County Team throughout the season with results not always going as we hoped, but the squad has worked hard and continues to do so throughout the winter. In our latest practice session, the players continued their short game skills training and had swing and shot analysis. Players have received the stats and video footage from this session plus information on areas that require improvement. They will work with their individual coaches over the winter to make changes before we meet again in January.

As I have said on many occasions, we are very lucky in this County to have such a talented group of players, an exciting mix of youth and experience who are willing to give their time and their talent to represent this County. However, without your support the team wouldn't function so I would like to take this opportunity to thank our President, Rosemary for her endless fund raising through her Presidents Day and to thank all of you for your continued support of the County Teams.

2ND TEAM CAPTAIN:

Mrs Poole reported:

This has been my 1st year as County 2nd team captain and I have really enjoyed it. It has been quite an experience and I hope that the team going forward will also feel that we can all learn by our mistakes and look forward to our matches next year. Though our results haven't always been the best, there has been some very good golf played throughout the season.

Our season started off with a friendly against Lincolnshire at Market Rasen, where we lost 7-2. Jane Mitchell from Ely made her debut. The next friendly against Northants played at Ely won overall 5-4

Our Interclub matches, Bedfordshire at Brampton we won 6 -3 Essex at Benton Hall we lost 5 ½ – 3 ½. Rosemary Walker from Girton made her debut there.

Hertfordshire at Old Ford Manor, 5 ½ – 3 ½

Suffolk at Royston in July – 2 of their team players forgot to turn up so we played only 2 matches in the morning and won both and in the foursomes in the afternoon with their captain playing in place of one player, we won 6-3

The finals were played at Aldeburgh and we played against Norfolk. We lost overall to Norfolk 7 ½ – 1 ½

Essex took the Trophy with Hertfordshire in 2nd place.

This is the first year that we have 5 counties in our inter-county Trophy and we probably will need to up our games to beat both Herts. and Essex, but it will certainly be something to strive and work for in our practice sessions early next year.

We have a couple of new ladies and Juniors who will be joining us next year for practice sessions and hopefully will be included in the team for 2010. Susan Fenwick (Abbotsley) was awarded her team colours and I would like to take this opportunity of thanking her and all the team for all their support, and wishing Sue and her family lots of luck in her move to Australia this year. I would also like to thank all the clubs for courtesy of their courses, they have all been very generous.

VETERAN'S CAPTAIN:

Miss Barclay reported:

During the year a total of 33 players from 13 different clubs played for the Veterans' team in the five matches. We started the season well with a draw against Essex at Gosfield Lakes. In the next match against Northants played at Kingsthorpe we lost 5½-3½. Our only victory came against Bedfordshire at The Links, the score being 3 – 1. We had a tough match against Norfolk at Swaffham and lost 3-1. The final match at Menzies resulted in a draw against Suffolk. This match was a little disappointing as Suffolk turned up with seven rather than eight players.

I would like to thank all the ladies who played in these matches. The matches are played in a friendly yet very competitive spirit. Once again I would like to thank the Clubs who gave us courtesy of their courses for our matches.

JUNIOR ORGANISER:

Mrs Tuttle reported:

This is the end of my 2nd year as County Junior Organiser and it's been a year of ups and downs.

I take heart from the highlights, which include:

- Chelsey Herbert (Gog Magog) being selected for the joint girls and adults Welsh Squad after a good performance in the Home Internationals back in the summer: only 14 players have been invited.
- The Ladies County Championship was supported by 8 girls, out of a total field of 36. Five girls were selected to represent the Ladies County 1st Team in County Week, at Stock Brook Manor Golf Club, Essex. Claire Tuttle (Links) also had a very successful Championship by reaching the semi-final of the Plate competition on her first time playing in the event.
- Miranda Brain once again reaching the World Final of the Faldo Series, winning a trip to Brazil. I'm sure she learned a lot from the experience.
- Initiatives by Pros such as Paul Toyer at St Neots who now runs a dedicated junior girls coaching group which enables them to make new friends, so as not to be intimidated by boys hitting it further and hopefully having the confidence to go out on the course together.
- Holes-in-one for Laura Tuttle (Links) and Emily Slater (Girton).
- Chelsey Herbert and Miranda Brain coming 3rd in their respective age groups at the Midland Champion of Champions at Cotgrave Place Golf & Country Club.
- Chelsey Herbert crowned Cambs & Hunts Junior County Champion for 2009.
- Organising an extremely successful inaugural East Region Girls Championship at Links GC in August (a difficult act for Essex to follow in 2010!). With the course record being broken twice in one day, one of them from Chelsey Herbert, this was an event enjoyed by all. Laura Tuttle took 2nd place in the 36-hole handicap event and Chelsey Herbert took 3rd place in the 36-hole scratch event. A special thanks to the very supportive Ladies and Gents at Links GC who helped me so much throughout the day.
- Sarah Smith and Chelsey Herbert for having the audacity to win the Scratch Knockout, beating the experienced Links pairing of Sarah Greenall and Marcella Tuttle on the 21st hole.
- The Rookies County Junior Training Programme being a real success this year under the helm of Sue Hill. 9 girls have now been selected to take part in training to develop them further. Sue will continue to keep an eye out for new talent.
- The 1st team beating Bedfordshire 6-0, Suffolk 4-2 and halving to Essex.
- The continuing success of the 2nd team helping to create the next generation of 1st team players.
- Membership of girls in clubs is on the increase. For example: Gog Magog now have 14 girls and Newmarket have 7.
- Two very successful 'Have a Go' days held at Menzies and the Gogs again. My thanks go Rosemary Hay and Caroline Shaw for organising very successful events yet again.
- Emily Slater continuing to do well on the British Junior Golf Tour .and being able to upload news stories to a brand new website.

Looking forward my plans include:

- Developing the training further by organising a small amount of short game sessions for the Elite and Futures squads. It is clear that some girls in the Rookies Squad are making progress at a faster rate than others and therefore we have split the group and set different targets. This enables the girls to reach their true potential.

- Working with the County Golf Partnership to select talented youngsters not yet at county standard for the Club & Coach programme.
- The production of the 2010 Cambs & Hunts Junior Girls Handbook which will be available to each Club and Driving Range to handout when a new girl joins or attends sessions to give them an insight into how the County works.
- The 2nd presentation of trophies and Get-Together evening in January for parents and girls.
- Developing the next generation of 1st team players as I will be losing 4 of my single figure handicaps in one year's time.
- The possibility of being on the team for implementing the first Junior County Week for the East Region in 2011. Junior County Weeks are already held in other regions.

And now some lowlights:

- The disappointment of the 1st team only coming 4th in the East Region league after being joint leader with two matches to play. This was due primarily to us not having our top players there on the day and being up against Norfolk and Hertfordshire in a 3-way match play event, who were always going to be difficult opponents even with our strongest team.
- Not enough time in the day and not enough help. It's not an easy task doing this job with a full time job, so if anyone would like to join us on the Junior Committee, please don't hesitate to contact me. No previous experience required! I am not planning on staying forever!
- Order of Merit and Handicap Challenge initiatives not getting off the ground due to lack of time and volunteers.
- The disappointment of the ELGA Trust being unable to subsidise individual coaching for the girls, which some parents have relied on in the past.

Let me finish on a positive note. My thanks must go to you all for supporting the girls at your clubs by playing with them and encouraging them. I must also thank my wonderful committee, especially, my rock, Maureen for supporting me throughout the year.

COMPETITION SECRETARY:

Mrs McCall reported:

Thanks to all who supported this year's County competitions. Numbers entering the Championship, Division 1 and Division 2 meetings were down on those for 2008, but the numbers entering the Division 3/High Handicap meeting showed a welcome increase.

Numbers for all other competitions were very similar to those in 2008.

Copies of the full results for 2009 have been supplied to each club delegate and of note must be Julie Walter (St Ives) winning the County Championship and Sarah Greenall (Links) and Julie Walter (St Ives) winning the Foursomes Championship for the sixth time. County fixtures for 2010 have also been supplied to Club Delegates in the hope that clubs do not make fixtures on the County competition dates. The fixtures follow the same pattern as in 2009 apart from the Foursomes Championship which has been moved from April to July.

Again this year fixtures, competition rules, draws and results have all been available on the County website and will be available on the new Website.

Entry fees in 2010 will be as in 2009 - £20 for 18 hole competitions and £26 for 36 hole competitions, and the club fee for the Mary Cole Rose Bowl will also stay the same - £10 per club. Please continue to encourage your club members to enter the competitions which are very good value.

The general competition conditions in the 'Blue Book' will be amended as follows:

- Use of buggies in competitions – EWGA transportation policy to be followed. This includes a written request needed from ladies who wish to use a buggy in a competition.
- Only ladies with active handicaps will be entitled to enter County competitions.
- Statement on the use of Distance Measuring Devices will be amended to follow the EWGA policy once EWGA have reviewed their use at the end of the year.

In 2010 the County will be hosting the East Region round of the Australian Spoons competition at Ely so please encourage your club to run this competition. We will also be hosting the East Anglian competition.

This is my last year as Competition Secretary and I have enjoyed doing the job and meeting and working with many of you during the running of the competitions. Thanks to all members of the Association who have helped me and especially:

- the clubs in the County who have so generously given us courtesy of their courses.
- the Club Delegates who have worked hard helping to arrange the various meetings and encouraging their members to enter the competitions.
- Ewing Associates for sponsoring the County Championship again - their last year of doing so.
- Greta Barclay our Press Officer for her excellent reports in local papers throughout the County.
- Kathy Musgrave, the Assistant Competition Secretary, President Rosemary and the Executive Committee for their support and help throughout the season.

I wish the future competition secretary success and hope she enjoys running the competitions as much as I have.

ASSISTANT COMPETITIONS SECRETARY:

Mrs Musgrave reported

My thanks to Lakeside Lodge and Royston Golf Clubs for generously giving courtesy for the Grace Norman and Jean Wilkinson finals respectively; also to their County Delegates for their invaluable help organising these events.

19 clubs competed for the Grace Norman Trophy, 17 for the Jean Wilkinson Trophy, 12 in the Scratch Leagues. Thanks to all players for competing in a good spirit and to all Lady and Scratch Captains for ensuring the competitions ran smoothly. Unfortunately we have to say goodbye to Cromwell in the JW for 2010; they feel they have insufficient players to guarantee fielding a team if illness and injury strike. Thanks to all their players who turned out to honour this year's fixtures despite difficulties.

Abbotsley have not entered a Scratch team for 2010 so the Leagues have been adjusted to give 4 teams in each Division.

After the disappointing cancellation of the Scratch Foursomes Match Play last year it was gratifying to have support for the new format from players and the Clubs that gave courtesy for the home matches; the event was very competitively contested, the final at Menzies going to the 21st hole.

It is still intended to run a County Ladder for Category 1&2 players from 1st Oct 2010 with it being self administered via our new website.

Thanks to President Rosemary Farrow and all the committee for their support, but particularly to Margaret McCall for all her help and support; I have very much enjoyed working with you, Margaret over the last 4 years.

I look forward to working with Lin Smith and to meeting the new Lady Captains in January 2010 and to another rewarding year.

SCRATCH SCORE ASSESSOR:

No Report.

HANDICAP ADVISOR:

Mrs Ratcliffe read Mrs Flemings report:

Please accept my apologies for not being with you today.

This year has seen a change in administration of medals from LGU to EWGA. As there is to be only one winner from each club at the end of the year, the majority have continued to run their own competition in conjunction with the EWGA medal

In 2010 the CONGU handicap of any player, who has not returned 3 qualifying scores during this current year, will be inactive and will not become active again until 3 qualifying scores have been returned next year. These scores can be Supplementary scores or from 9 or 18 hole qualifying competitions, but not from EWGA medals as a player must have an active handicap to compete in these. Clubs may decide what other competitions will be open to players with inactive handicaps but should ensure there are sufficient opportunities for players to regain their active handicap.

At the time of writing we still await further instructions from EWGA on the use of Distance Measuring Devices in medals.

Next year (2010) should see the introduction of the Central Database of Handicaps, and where it has not already been done the end of year update to the handicapping program for computers should enable clubs to participate. Any questions or problems concerning this or any other aspect of the handicapping system will be dealt with fully at the meeting for Handicap Secretaries in mid January.

This report is my last as Handicap Adviser, a position I have held and thoroughly enjoyed for the last five years. It has been a challenging experience to try to solve all the problems you have presented to me, and I will miss not being in touch with you all, but I feel it is time to move on, and with your approval I hope to leave you in the very capable hands of Elaine Cardwell who has served as my deputy and shown herself to be knowledgeable with a quick grasp of any changes to the system.

My best wishes to the Executive Committee and you all for 2010.

REGIONAL DELEGATE:

Mrs McCall reported:

There are 4 meetings held in the year, with one delegate from each Eastern County. The meetings are for dissemination of information - from EWGA to Counties and vice versa - and for the Counties to discuss items of mutual interest to achieve uniformity across the Counties. EWGA urge ladies to sign up for the EWGA newsletter by email, with the incentive of a prize hamper being offered to 1 lucky winner.

6. TREASURER'S REPORT AND STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS:

Miss Skerry reported:

Income: The subscription for 2009 – 1694 members, 20 down on last year (1724)

Sponsorships & Donations. We would like to thank Ewing Associates for the continued support of the County Championships, also thanks for donations of £32 and £500 from CAGU for the county Cards.

Presidents made a profit of £1,793. County Teams ran a fund raising event last October which raised £1,486

Expenditure: County Teams Coaching, a full programme of coaching was taken during the year

Uniforms: This was to purchase new items of uniform for both the 1st and 2nd teams

County Week: The cost of this has decreased because it was held by a different county this year.

Administration: Increase due to purchase of new laptop and printer and also includes set up costs of new website.

Junior Accounts: Income, competition increase due to the playing of the East Region Girls Championship. Donations: £1,000 from C&HLCGA and £1,100 donated for the Junior Matchplay Finals held last October.

Expenditure: Several events were held for the Match Squad and to promote golf to new starters.

The accounts have been signed by the auditor as a true and fair view

7. ELECTION OF AUDITOR FOR 2010:

The Treasurer's proposition that Mr John Johnson continue as auditor for 2010 was seconded by Miss Lesley Ford (Cromwell) agreed by a show of voting slips.

8. TO APPROVE AFFILIATIONS FEES FOR 2011:

Madam Treasurer proposed that the 2011 be set at £8, which was seconded by Mrs Maureen Mansfield (Girton)

9. ADOPTION OF OFFICERS REPORTS & VOTE OF THANKS:

Miss J Walter (St Ives,) County Champion offered a vote of thanks to the Executive Committee for all their hard work on the member's behalf which was much appreciated.
